What is a Parish Council?

A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of people in the parish. They are the lowest tier of local government, falling under district and County Councils.

Kingmoor Parish Council serves the communities of **Cargo, Crindledyke** and **Stainton** and represents residents on matters affecting the Parish.

What Do Your Councillors Do?

Kingmoor Parish Council has eight Councillors plus a Clerk, meetings are held every other month at the Rockcliffe Centre. All the Councillors are voluntary, part-time and take neither salary nor expenses whereas the Clerk, receives a small salary.

Kingmoor Parish Councillors are very 'hands-on' and play a vital role in representing the best interests of the community they serve. Their powers and duties cover many things we take for granted in making for comfort and well being in the areas we live. Planning, Transport and Traffic, Highways, recreational areas, litter / dog fouling, benches and bus shelters and public footpaths are just some of the areas that concern our Parish Councillors who regularly meet with City and County Councillors regarding these topics.
