Re-opening of Play Equipment

Risk Assessment

The Government recently announced that Play Parks could be re-opened on 4 July 2020 and subsequently produced guidance offering "practical advice on how these can be reopened and managed effectively to enable their use while minimising the transmission risk of COVID-19". The guidance is available at:

The guidance includes a requirement to "carry out an appropriate COVID-19 risk assessment". It is made very clear that "Failure to complete a risk assessment which takes account of COVID-19, or completing a risk assessment but failing to put in place sufficient measures to manage the risk of COVID-19, could constitute a breach of health and safety law". On that basis, this Risk Assessment takes each of the Key Principles as set out in the guidance and assesses whether or not practical arrangements can be put in place in the context of Cargo Play area.

Face Coverings	If possible, a face covering should be worn in enclosed public spaces where social distancing isn't possible and where the public may come into contact with people they do not normally meet. (Face coverings should not be used by children under the age of 3 or those who may find it difficult to manage them correctly).	The Play-Area is not in an enclosed public space, and is unlikely to be ever be considered a 'crowded' space.	Guidance on face covering will be included in the signage installed on site.
Additional Measures and Communicating with Parents	Promote responsible behaviour by children, parents, carers and guardians. Considering Children with Additional Needs	Take into account the requirements of children with additional needs.	The Covid 19 pandemic has not altered the accessibility of the play area.	N/A
Keeping Staff Safe	Consider the risks staff may be exposed to and how these can be mitigated. Staff roles may include: • cleaning playground equipment/surrounding areas • managing queues of those waiting to use equipment to ensure users comply with rules made by the owner/operator	Kingmoor Parish Council only have one member of staff employed for part of a day per week, as noted above the Parish Council are not able to offer staff resource to manning and cleaning the play area on a daily basis.	The Volunteer Council member erecting the new signage will be advised to wear gloves whilst erecting the new signs, and to carry hand sanitiser with them, and to wash their hands on return to their home.

Conclusions

New signage to be erected at the Cargo play area and the play area at Crindledyke, covering the matters discussed in the risk assessment above. The risk assessment will be reviewed and retained following any future alteration to governmental regulations.
